People: In the first petition, which is, "Hallowed be thy name," we

pray, that God would enable us, and others, to glorify him in all that whereby he makes himself known, and that he

would dispose all things to his own glory.

Minister: What do we pray for in the second petition?

People: In the second petition, which is, "Thy kingdom come,"

we pray, that Satan's kingdom may be destroyed; and that the kingdom of grace may be advanced, ourselves and others brought into it, and kept in it; and that the

kingdom of glory may be hastened.

WEEKLY SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Use these questions to reflect more deeply on this week's sermon.

- 1. What are some things that appear to restrict the progress of the gospel, and how does God overcome these barriers?
- 2. How could Paul's imprisonment make others more bold in preaching the gospel?
- 3. What things prevent believers from speaking boldly about Christ?
- 4. Why does Paul say he is unconcerned with the selfish motives of the rival preachers, and how can we adopt a similar attitude?
- 5. Where do we see rivalry, selfish ambition, and pretense in the church today, and how does this passage give us guidance for dealing with it?

MONTHLY SCRIPTURE MEMORIZATION

"...for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist" (1 Corinthians 8:6).

ABOUT WORSHIP

In his encounter with the woman of Samaria, Jesus explained that "God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24). The reason Jesus says true worshipers must worship in this way is because God himself "is spirit." Here we discover the simple yet profound principle that true worship is a response to God as he has personally revealed himself. Thus, conformity to God's character is the key to true worship. "Great is the LORD," as the psalmist puts it, "and greatly to be praised" (Psalm 48:1)! In worship, we seek to reflect this divine reality, declaring with our lips and demonstrating with our lives that God is supremely precious and therefore worthy of all glory and honor and praise.

THE SHAPE OF WORSHIP



Entering God's Presence—We gather in response to God's call to worship, joyfully offering praise to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. With reverence and awe, we confess our sins and receive God's forgiveness, which is declared in Jesus' name.



Renewing Our Faith—Worship continues with a focus on God's Word. Our faith is renewed as we publicly confess the truth of God, join our hearts and voices in prayers and hymns of praise to God, and hear the good news of God powerfully proclaimed.



Responding in Thanks—As hearing becomes doing, we respond to the proclamation of God's Word. Songs of praise continue to be raised and the gifts and offerings of God's people are collected. On Communion Sundays we are invited to celebrate the Lord's Supper. With God's blessing upon us, we are sent into the world to love and serve the risen Lord Jesus Christ!

Why Do We Worship in This Way?

Question: Why are we so often reminded in Scripture to give thanks to the Lord? Answer: In I Corinthians 4:7, the Apostle Paul asks "What do you have that you did not receive?" Every breath you breathe every moment of your life is a gift from God (cf. Job 33:4 and 34:14-15). It is right to express thanks to the Giver of every good gift. "Gratitude exclaims, very properly, 'How good of God to give me this" (C.S. Lewis). As Christians, we know God as the Giver not only of life, but of everlasting life. God has given his Son to redeem us. "Thanks be to God for his inexpressible gift" (II Cor. 9:15)!
