Minister: What is justifying faith?

People: Justifying faith is a saving grace that works in the

hearts of sinners by the Spirit and the Word of God. By it sinners are convinced of their sinfulness and miserable condition and realize that neither they nor anyone or anything else can get them out of that lost condition, and by it they give full assent to the truth of the gospel promise; they receive and rest on Christ and his righteousness for pardon from sin, as the gospel tells us, and for being accepted and accounted as righteous in the sight of God for salvation.

Until their death no pains they know; their strength is firm from day to day.


They share no part in others' woe; nor plagued as other men are they.








- 4. Why did John the Baptist's disciples need to be baptized?
- 5. What does Acts 19:8-10 contribute to the overall progress of Luke's story in the book of Acts? What does it teach us about "the Way"?

#### MONTHLY SCRIPTURE MEMORIZATION

Devote time to memorizing this passage of Scripture throughout the month.

"The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead" (Acts 17:30-31).

#### ABOUT WORSHIP

In his encounter with the woman of Samaria, Jesus explained that "God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24). The reason Jesus says true worshipers must worship in this way is because God himself "is spirit." Here we discover the simple yet profound principle that true worship is a response to God as he has personally revealed himself. Thus, conformity to God's character is the key to true worship. "Great is the LORD," as the psalmist puts it, "and greatly to be praised" (Psalm 48:1)! In worship, we seek to reflect this divine reality, declaring with our lips and demonstrating with our lives that God is supremely precious and therefore worthy of all glory and honor and praise.

#### THE SHAPE OF WORSHIP



**Entering God's Presence**—We gather in response to God's call to worship, joyfully offering praise to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. With reverence and awe, we confess our sins and receive God's forgiveness, which is declared in Jesus' name.



**Renewing Our Faith**—Worship continues with a focus on God's Word. Our faith is renewed as we publicly confess the truth of God, join our hearts and voices in prayers and hymns of praise to God, and hear the good news of God powerfully proclaimed.



**Responding in Thanks**—As hearing becomes doing, we respond to the proclamation of God's Word. Songs of praise continue to be raised and the gifts and offerings of God's people are collected. On Communion Sundays we are invited to celebrate the Lord's Supper. With God's blessing upon us, we are sent into the world to love and serve the risen Lord Jesus Christ!

### Why Do We Worship in This Way?

In this section, we answer a question about worship each week.

Question: Why do we take time to pass the offering plate during the worship service?

Answer: Throughout both the Old and the New Testaments, the sharing of material resources and contributions is described as an act of worship (Deuteronomy 26:1-15; 1 Chronicles 29:10-22; 2 Corinthians 9:12). In Hebrews 13:16, sharing material resources is even described as a sacrifice that is pleasing to God. Therefore, the offering is not merely a practical matter but a proper element of biblical worship.
