Heidelberg Catechism Questions & Answers #69 & 74

Minister: How does baptism remind you and assure you that

Christ's one sacrifice on the cross is for you personally?

People: In this way: Christ instituted this outward washing

and with it gave the promise that, as surely as water washes away the dirt from the body, so certainly his blood and his Spirit wash away my soul's impurity, in

other words, all my sins.

Minister: Should infants, too, be baptized?

People: Yes. Infants as well as adults are in God's covenant and

are his people. They no less that adults, are promised the forgiveness of sin through Christ's blood and the

Holy Spirit who produces faith.

Therefore, by baptism, the mark of the covenant, infants should be received into the Christian church and should be distinguished from the children of unbelievers. This was done in the Old Testament by circumcision, which was replaced in the New Testament by baptism.



WEEKLY SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Use these questions to reflect more deeply on this week's sermon.

- 1. What's the main point of this passage and how does it function within the last three chapters of Daniel (10-12)?
- 2. Who is the man clothed in linen in Daniel 10:5-9? Compare the dazzling description of this man with the description of Jesus in Revelation 1:13-16.
- 3. What are some important truths that we learn in this passage about angels and demons?
- 4. How does this passage prepare us for spiritual warfare and help us to "be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might" (Ephesians 6:10)? How do Paul's instructions on spiritual warfare in Ephesians 6:10-20 help us to apply lessons learned from Daniel 10:1-11:1?
- 5. What encouragement can we draw from the encouragement Daniel receives and gives in Daniel 10:10-11:1?

MONTHLY SCRIPTURE MEMORIZATION

Devote time to memorizing this passage of Scripture throughout the month.

"I saw in the night visions, and behold, with the clouds of heaven there came one like a son of man, and he came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before him. And to him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom..." (Daniel 7:13-14)

ABOUT WORSHIP

In his encounter with the woman of Samaria, Jesus explained that "God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24). The reason Jesus says true worshipers must worship in this way is because God himself "is spirit." Here we discover the simple yet profound principle that true worship is a response to God as he has personally revealed himself. Thus, conformity to God's character is the key to true worship. "Great is the LORD," as the psalmist puts it, "and greatly to be praised" (Psalm 48:1)! In worship, we seek to reflect this divine reality, declaring with our lips and demonstrating with our lives that God is supremely precious and therefore worthy of all glory and honor and praise.

THE SHAPE OF WORSHIP



Entering God's Presence—We gather in response to God's call to worship, joyfully offering praise to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. With reverence and awe, we confess our sins and receive God's forgiveness, which is declared in Jesus' name.



Renewing Our Faith—Worship continues with a focus on God's Word. Our faith is renewed as we publicly confess the truth of God, join our hearts and voices in prayers and hymns of praise to God, and hear the good news of God powerfully proclaimed.



Responding in Thanks—As hearing becomes doing, we respond to the proclamation of God's Word. Songs of praise continue to be raised and the gifts and offerings of God's people are collected. On Communion Sundays we are invited to celebrate the Lord's Supper. With God's blessing upon us, we are sent into the world to love and serve the risen Lord Jesus Christ!
